

# Graduate Certificate in Eurasian, Russian, & East European Studies

Candidates for the Master's degree in any of the graduate programs of the Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service may pursue the Certificate in Eurasian, Russian and East European Studies. The certificate requires demonstration of proficiency in one of the languages of the region and fifteen (15) credits for courses that represent an interdisciplinary approach to Eurasia and eastern Europe. Courses are selected in consultation with the CERES Associate Director, Dr. Jennifer Long.
